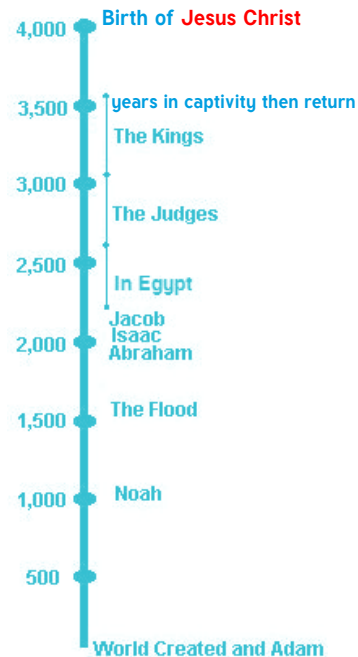

**Bible Study Activities** - You can pick a different one each time through the Bible

1. Make a Bible Overview, by writing a sentence for each chapter you read.
2. Make a Bible Overview, by writing a paragraph or more for each book.
3. Create a Bible Quiz book, by writing questions and answers for each chapter.
4. Draw a picture or outline for each book.
5. Draw a floorplan or layout of the tabernacle and the location of it's furniture.
6. Draw a floorplan of the temple and it's furniture.
7. Make a chart of the Judges by using the book of Judges.
8. Do a chart of the Kings, one column with the Kings of Israel, another column with the Kings of Judah. (Note: Saul, David, and Solomon were Kings of Israel before Israel was divided into Israel and Judah. You can read about the rest of the Kings in 1 Kings and 2 Kings.)
9. Make a chart of the parables, when reading in Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. ( A parable is a story, about life or nature, that teaches by similarity.)
